Author Guidelines, Publication Ethics and Editorial Policies

KSHITIJ accepts the following categories of submissions:

- Original Research Articles (Reports of original empirical, theoretical, experimental, or applied research)
- Review Articles (Critical and systematic reviews of literature that synthesize existing knowledge and identify future research directions)
- Short Communications (Brief reports of significant findings, innovative methodologies, or emerging issues)

Manuscript Preparation

The manuscript should be limited to between 2500-3000 words in MS Word document format (with body text in Times New Roman, Font size 12 for English and for Hindi Devlgs 010 and Kruti Dev, Font size 14.

Cover Letter: A covering letter should be sent with the submission providing brief overview of the manuscript's contents, highlighting its significance and potential contributions to the field.

Title Page: The title page of the submission should contain Title of the manuscript, Name(s) of author(s), Institutional affiliation(s), ORCID ID(s) (if available) , Email address of corresponding author, Contact number, Acknowledgement of funding support (if any)

To facilitate double-blind review, the title page should be submitted separately from the manuscript.

Title: The title of the manuscript should be concise, informative, and accurately reflect the content of your research. It should be descriptive and informative, while avoiding any unnecessary words or phrases. The title should also be written in a way that is accessible to a broad audience.

Abstract: An abstract must be inserted at the top of the article. It should provide a clear summary of the research, including the objectives, methods, and results. It should not be more than 250 words and should be written in a way that is easily understood by a broad audience with 4-5 key words at the end

Introduction: The introduction should provide a clear statement of the research problem, the objectives of the study, and the hypothesis or research questions being addressed. It should also provide a brief overview of the existing literature on the topic, highlighting the gaps in knowledge that your research aims to address. The introduction should end with a clear statement of the research aim and objectives.

Materials and Methods: The materials and methods section should provide a detailed description of the research methods used, including the design of the study, the sample size, the data collection methods, and the statistical analyses used. It should include enough detail to enable another researcher to replicate the study. If you are using a well-established methodology, you can refer to previous research for details. If you are using a new or modified methodology, you should provide a clear description of the process.

Results: The results section should present the findings of your research in a clear and concise manner. You should use tables and graphs to present your data, and avoid duplicating information in the text. You should also describe any statistical analyses that you have carried out, including the significance levels and confidence intervals.

Discussion: The discussion section should interpret the results in the context of the research problem and the existing literature. You should discuss the implications of the findings, the strengths and limitations of the study, and the implications for future research. You should also avoid over-generalizing the results and making claims that are not supported by the data.

Conclusion: The conclusion should summarize the main findings of the research and restate the research aim and objectives. It should also provide recommendations for future research and implications for practice.

Acknowledgements: Authors should acknowledge any financial support, technical assistance, or other contributions to the work.

References: The references should be formatted according to the journal's guidelines, using the appropriate citation style and should include all the sources cited in the text. You should ensure that the references are accurate, complete, and up-to-date. You should also avoid citing sources that are not relevant to your research or that do not provide reliable information.

The surname of the author and the date of publication are inserted directly into the text at the point where the author work is mentioned. The complete citation is to be arranged alphabetically and included in the reference list at the end of the paper.

Figures and Tables: Tables and figures can be useful for presenting data and summarizing your findings. They should be formatted correctly and should be accompanied by appropriate captions. Be sure to format tables and figures according to the journal's guidelines, and provide clear captions that explain what each table or figure represents.

Supplementary Materials

- Additional materials, such as large datasets, videos, or detailed protocols, may be submitted as supplementary materials.

- Supplementary materials should be clearly labeled and referenced in the main text.

Language and Style: You should write your manuscript in clear, concise, and grammatically correct English/ Hindi. You should avoid using jargon, technical terms, or acronyms that are not widely understood. You should also use active voice instead of passive voice, and avoid using first person pronouns.

Bio-note of Author (s): Not more than 100 words for each author in Times New Roman, 12 points, Italic, Justified, Single space.

Ethics and Conflict of Interest

The contributors should ensure that their research is conducted ethically and in compliance with relevant guidelines and regulations. A declaration should be submitted by the contributor regarding obtaining Informed consent from research participants, maintaining confidentiality, and avoiding any form of coercion or deception. This includes obtaining ethical approval for the study and disclosing any financial or personal relationships that may have influenced the research. If your research involves human subjects or animals, be sure to follow all relevant ethical guidelines and submit clearance from Institutional Ethics committee.

Plagiarism Policy: KSHITIJ has a strict zero-tolerance policy towards plagiarism. All manuscripts will be screened using plagiarism detection software. The acceptable overall similarity index is 10% (maximum). Manuscripts exceeding these limits may be rejected without review.

Artificial Intelligence (AI) Use Policy: KSHITIJ recognizes the growing use of Artificial Intelligence (AI) tools in research and academic writing. Authors may use AI tools for language editing, grammar correction, formatting assistance and literature search support

Mandatory Disclosure: Authors must disclose any use of AI tools in a separate section before the references.

Submission Process

Online Submission

- Manuscripts should be submitted through the KSHITIJ online submission system on <https://www.uotjournal.com>
- During submission, authors will need to provide information about the manuscript type, author details, conflicts of interest, funding sources, and any ethical considerations.

Peer Review Process

- All submitted manuscripts will undergo a double-blind peer review process, in which both the authors and reviewers remain anonymous.
- Reviewers will evaluate the manuscript based on its originality, methodology, results, and overall quality.

Revision and Resubmission

- Authors may be asked to revise their manuscript based on reviewer feedback.
- Revised manuscripts should be submitted with a point-by-point response to the reviewers' comments.

Publication Process

- Upon acceptance, manuscripts will undergo final editing and formatting by the KSHITIJ editorial team.

Proofreading and Corrections

- Authors will receive a proof of their manuscript for final review and approval before publication.
- Any corrections should be communicated to the editorial team promptly.

Copyright and Licensing

- Authors will be asked to sign a copyright transfer agreement.

Open Access

KSHITIJ provides immediate open access to all published content, supporting the global exchange of knowledge and research dissemination.

Research Integrity and Misconduct

Choose an Appropriate Manuscript Type

- Ensure that your manuscript fits any one of the journal's accepted types (e.g., original research articles, review articles, short communications, etc.) and follows the specific guidelines for that type.

Clearly Define the Research Problem

- Make sure your manuscript clearly states the research problem, the objectives of your study, and its significance to the field.

Conduct a Comprehensive Literature Review

- Provide a thorough review of the relevant literature, demonstrating your understanding of the current state of knowledge and how your research contributes to the field.

Present Your Data Clearly and Accurately

- Use clear, concise language to present your data, ensuring that tables and figures are well-organized and of high quality.

Address Reviewer Feedback

- Carefully consider the feedback provided by reviewers and address their comments and concerns in a revised version of your manuscript.

Proofread and Edit Your Manuscript

- Make sure your manuscript is free of grammatical errors and inconsistencies before submission, seeking assistance from a professional language editing service if needed.
